Bebras Computer Challenge: As part of our computing curriculum, pupils in year groups 2-6 entered the Bebras Computational Thinking Competition. This is an annual worldwide competition supported by Oxford University and Raspberry Pi. One of our pupils has **reached the national finals which means he was in the top very small percentage across the countries taking part.** He will do this challenge online sometime this coming week. Thank you for working with us to encourage a love of reading and to help develop your child's reading skills. Reading at home with your child shows them that reading is valued and develops a culture of reading that impacts on future success. Research shows that children who read at home daily will have heard 296,660 words by the time they were 5 years old compared to those who are never read to, only hearing 4,662 words!
